QUINAULT INDIAN NATION VICTIM AWARENESS FORM

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS:

"IF YOU ARE THE CIVTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, you can ask the prosecuting attorney to file a criminal complaint. You also have the right to file a petition in tribal court requesting an order for protection from domestic abuse which could include any of the following:

- a) An order restraining your abuser from further acts of abuse;
- b) An order directing your abuser to leave your household.
- An order preventing your abuser from entering your residence, school, business, or place of employment;
- d) An order awarding you or the other parent custody of or visitation with your minor child or children;
- e) An order restraining your abuser from molesting or interfering with minor children in your custody;
- f) An order preventing your abuser from transferring any property or assets except in the usual course of business; and
- g) An order directing the party not granted custody of any minor children to pay temporary support to the custodial parent if there is a legal obligation to do so.

The forms you need to obtain a protection order are available in tribal court. Information about shelters and alternatives to domestic violence is available from the listed sources.

Domestic violence is a serious concern. If you believe that you or a member of your family or household is a victim of domestic violence, there are a number of people and/or agencies that offer assistance. For more information, please contact:
